



## Bonnie Hatch Weston

October 8, 1952 - January 2, 2025

Bonnie Hatch Weston, age 72, after a courageous decade-long battle with Parkinsons multiple systems atrophy, passed away peacefully at home on January 2, 2025 surrounded by her loving family. Bonnie's strength and resilience remained steadfast until the end. A gifted and accomplished tennis player, Bonnie thrived in an active lifestyle that included hiking, boating, fishing, scuba diving, skiing and travel. Her thoughtfulness, generosity, and vibrant presence enriched the lives of all who knew her. Bonnie's legacy of love, service, and kindness will continue to inspire her family and the countless individuals whose lives she touched.

Born in Buffalo, New York, to Virginia Lou Casten and Chauncey Ransom Hatch Jr., Bonnie was the third of four daughters (Sherrie Hatch Hale, Laurie Hatch, Hollie Hatch Lindauer). She spent her early years on the family farm, where she developed a lifelong passion for American Saddlebred horses, tennis, and the great outdoors. In the mid-1960s, the Hatch family relocated to Vero Beach, Florida, where Bonnie's enthusiasm for an active, adventurous lifestyle truly blossomed.

Bonnie graduated from Graham-Eckes in Palm Beach and began college at

Green Mountain College in Vermont. She transferred home to Indian River Community College to complete an Associates degree and then on to the University of South Florida, where she met her future husband, Andrew (Andy) Weston. They married and settled in Miami, Florida, where they raised three children. In

2011, Bonnie and Andy moved to the beautiful surroundings of Jupiter, Florida that she loved.

Bonnie's commitment to her community was unwavering. She made lasting contributions to

charitable organizations, becoming a life member of Woman's Cancer Association (WCA) at the

University of Miami, where she served as President from 2007 to 2009. She was a life member of the Junior Orange Bowl Committee, where she contributed to various committees, including the Parade, Auction, and Basketball. Bonnie's passion for philanthropy was evident in her tireless efforts to raise vital funds for these organizations and the causes she cared about.

Bonnie is survived by her husband, Andy, her three children and their spouses: David & Leanne

Weston, Richard & Jenelle Weston, and Christina (Weston) & Andrew Oshan and six beloved

grandchildren, who were the light of her life.
