



Calvin "Cal" Frankland Boyle

April 23, 1945 - May 31, 2020

Calvin Frankland Boyle, also known as Cal, passed away at the age of 75, at Jupiter Medical Center on May 31, 2020. He was born in Paterson, New Jersey to Gerald Norman Boyle and Lois Frankland Nichols now deceased and pre-deceased, grandmother Florence Frankland. He is survived by his wife Donna Garren Boyle, Tequesta, FL; mother-in-law Doris Garren; Flat Rock, NC; brother-in-law Davis Garren and wife Elaine Garren, Boiling Springs, SC; and brother-in-law, Kenneth Garren and pre-deceased wife Debbie Garren in Fuquay-Varina, NC. In addition, he is survived by to 2 nephews and 4 nieces and 13 great nephews and nieces by marriage.

After graduating from Florida State University with a Master's degree, Cal taught Industrial Arts and Aviation at Lake Worth High for ten years. During that time he also coached tennis and cross-country and made plans to start his business in 1981. He was involved in general contracting and development activities until he retired in 2000. While he was in business he was chosen as the "National Remodeling Contractor of the Year" (1990) by the National Association of Home Builders, the "Palm Beach County Builder of the Year" by the Home Builders and Contractors Association of Palm Beach County and by "Remodeling Magazine" as one of the top 50 building companies in the Nation. His lifelong interests have been centered around aviation (owned several planes) sports cars & GTP race cars, motorcycles, woodworking, book collecting (6,000 plus), and various sports (tennis, skiing, scuba diving &

mountain climbing). In retirement he spent time playing tennis and traveling in England, Scotland and New England with his wife Donna of 25 years. He was loved by many and will be truly missed.

A private service was held on Friday, June 5th at Taylor and Modeen Funeral Home. He was laid to rest at Hillcrest Memorial Park in West Palm Beach, FL.
