I was victim to many a mean girl moment, but you gave me the tools to persevere. To walk into Rye HS with my head held high, with my new pixie haircut, when it was fashionable for sure, but hard to be the early adopter, to stand out & be different. You gave me that look at me attitude in my snazzy, totally in style, fabulous new outfit from Kaplans. How many young girls got to go into NYC to do a photo shoot for 17 Magazine! & that wasn't because daddy was in the business, it had nothing to do with him. I was insecure but it was you who gave me that confidence & strength to get past the hard stuff which has kept me strong my entire life.

You gave that strength to all my friends, who loved sitting at your kitchen table, eating your delicious food! You made them comfortable to share their stories & woes & then we would play games, have fun & push the harder stuff aside. I recently reminisced with my old friend Linda of a time when she & I were visiting you in Florida & there was a hurricane coming. We were panic stricken because we realized we weren't prepared. We went to several stores before we finally found the critical hurricane supplies we needed, Skipo cards!!

Mom, you taught me to accept all people, to ask questions, to learn. You allowed the exposure to happen, you didn't over protect, you let us experience everything even when it was so foreign to you & you were scared & all you wanted to do was run back to the Bronx. You encouraged us to find & embrace all the exciting things around us. When daddy died I was in college. As we all know his tragic death was unbearable & I had immediately decided that I wasn't going back to college. As the oldest I had to stay behind to take care of

you, Mary Jean & Carolyn. But when you heard my plan you absolutely refused, you said I had to go back. You knew how important that time in my life was & you gave me that gift.

Mom, you helped me so much when my family was young & raising them wasn't enough for me, I had to find more & you gave me the ability to go off & start my own business & run every committee at the elementary school, while you watched the kids, cooked, washed & worked in the sweat shop in the basement! You gave me that ability to satisfy my own needs for more adventures & still maintain a loving delicious home for my girls & George & I.

You loved with actions as when Elise, Rick & Matthew came to visit us in California. Matthew got so sick & hospitalized with Meningitis. They tried desperately to get all the recipes in preparation for this day so they could cook in loving memory of you. They will always remember their grandma especially every time they shuffle a deck of cards, the woman who taught them so much & especially how to gamble & play poker!

We so wanted you to be able to come to Alexis & Marc's wedding, but we know you will be with us, sending all your love.

We are thrilled that Jack got to meet his GiGi. We know he was one of the only things that put a smile on your face, even in your final days.

Mom, we will all miss you desperately.

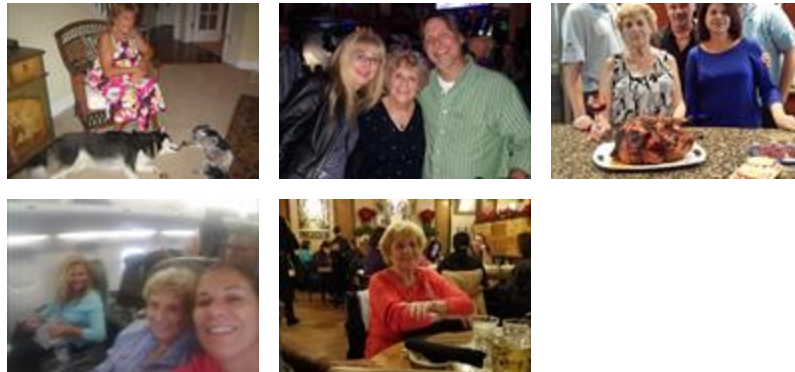
