



Cecil A. Collins

June 8, 1936 - December 23, 2016

Cecil Allen Collins, cherished by his family and countless friends, is remembered as a loving husband, father, grandfather, father-in-law, uncle, and devoted friend. He passed away on Friday, December 23, 2016 at the age of 80.

Cecil was born to parents Blanche and Ray Collins on June 8, 1936 in Detroit, Michigan. He grew up the youngest of four siblings and married Mary Louise Grzena in 1953, sister of his close friend, Jack.

Cecil "fibbed" about his age when he hired into Fisher Corporation at age of 17 because with a wife and the first of 10 children to support, the word "lie" just doesn't seem to fit. Cecil started in the pressroom, doing whatever job he was assigned, eventually becoming the Director of Research and Development, working for the company for 51 years. For many years, after finishing the first shift at Fisher Corporation, he worked the second shift at various gas stations in the area.

In 1957 Cecil moved his ever growing family from Detroit to Waterford, Michigan.

In 1964 Cecil got the idea of a push button seat belt buckle. He built a prototype that he took home, placing it on the refrigerator until he was able to

work out some crude sketches which he took to the president of Fisher Corporation, Robert Fisher. Robert immediately saw the merit of Cecil's idea and applied for a worldwide patent with him. The issued patent was the start of an innovative business for the Fisher family, Fisher Corporation, and General Safety Corporation.

In 1969, Cecil decided to enlarge the 900 square foot house the family of 12 lived in by building a family room, two more bedrooms, and a 40 foot carport/garage. Money was still tight and he decided to do all of the work himself. He spent a lot of time at the library learning the basics of home building and then began a two-year long project, digging footings by hand, mixing and pouring concrete, and pounding nails. He approached this project as he did all projects, never allowing himself to be overwhelmed by its size but dissecting it into small, manageable pieces. This approach served Cecil well over the years because even though he left school in eighth grade he absorbed knowledge like a sponge and with his intuitive mechanical ability, he had 25 U.S. patents issued in his name. He continued to love tinkering and creatively solved problems until his death, e.g., taking apart an umbrella and using the opening/closing mechanism as a tool to pull up his socks.

In the early 1980's, Cecil moved with Mary and his youngest five children to Jupiter, Florida to become the Vice-President of Rybovich Boat Works, owned by Robert Fisher. After 10 years Robert sold the boatyard. Cecil returned to Michigan to become Director of Research and Development at General Safety Corporation where he remained until his retirement in 2004, At that time he moved back to Jupiter, Florida.

Once, a dear nephew, wisely observed that Cecil could enter a room of strangers, walk out with multiple lifelong friends, and be admired and respected by the remainder of those present.

In 2012, Cecil's loving wife of 58 years, Mary Lou passed away. Cecil grew close to Joan Miga who became his dear and constant companion, an unexpected but welcome blessing at this time in their lives.

Cecil is survived by his children, Allen (Kara) Collins, Kerrilyn O'Connor, Kelly (Gary) Brown, Daniel (Kimberly) Collins, Connie (William) Oblaczynski, Chris Pittman, Colleen (Thomas) FitzGerald, Michael (Melody Hackett) Collins, Carol (Linda Unwin) Collins, and Karen (Frederick) Porter; 34 grandchildren, 18 great-grandchildren and numerous nieces, nephews, and friends.
