She is survived by her husband Chris Barlow and their two children Kyle and Kayla, her sister Melanie Wicks and her brother Michael Wicks and nephew Joshua Wicks. She is preceded in death by her mother Beverly Ann Wicks, née Brown.

Cindy earned a bachelor's degree in Ecology from the University of Florida in 1998, where she also minored in Zoology. While attending UF she was an intern on a research project that captured, measured, tagged, and released sturgeon on the Suwannee River. This study was performed by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, and she considered it the most satisfying work of her career.

Her work as a Certified Wildlife Biologist began in Southwest Florida and continued in Southeast Florida when she and her husband Chris moved to North Palm Beach County in 2001. Cindy loved Florida's vast biodiversity and all its wildlife, most especially bald eagles. She developed a love of photography while documenting her field observations and had a small photography business where she enjoyed photo shoots showcasing people's beloved fur babies.
