



Eric "Ricky" Wilson

January 19, 1962 - May 12, 2025

Eric Scott Lee Wilson, 63, of Jupiter, Florida passed away peacefully on May 12, 2025, after a courageous battle with esophageal cancer. He was surrounded by the love of his family, most especially his sister, Dawyn, who served as his devoted caretaker during the final months of his life - a role she embraced with deep love, compassion, and strength.

Born on January 19, 1962, in Frenchtown, New Jersey, Eric spent most of his life in Jupiter, Florida where he built a life grounded in faith, family and hard work. He began working at UPS at just 18 years old and remained a loyal and dedicated employee for over four decades until his well-earned retirement. His work ethic, humility, and sense of duty were the foundation of who he was.

Eric's greatest pride and joy was his family. He was a loving and devoted father to his sons, Cody Wilson (wife Taylor) and Ryder Wilson (wife Kelsey), and an adoring grandfather to Maverick, Wyatt, and Cash Wilson. He was joyfully awaiting the arrival of his fourth grandson, Beckett Wilson. Eric's love for his sons ran deep - he cheered them on in every chapter of life, offering steady support, words of wisdom and unwavering pride. His grandsons brought him immeasurable joy, and he cherished every laugh, hug, and memory made with them.

Those who knew Eric will remember him as the kindest soul in any room. He

treated everyone like family - generous with his time, always friendly and deeply genuine. He had a way of making people feel seen and appreciated and that rare gift left a lasting impression on all who met him. He also had a classic "Eric" trait that everyone came to love - he always "knew a guy." Need a mechanic? A painter? Someone to fix your A/C? Eric had a guy. His endless list of trusted connections became a running joke and a comforting reminder that if Eric was in your corner, he had a solution.

Eric lived a rich, fulfilling life full of joy, generosity and purpose. He enjoyed life's simple pleasures- cheering on the Philadelphia Eagles, cold plunging, biking, working out, cooking up his famous empanadas and savoring lobster tails and steak - his favorite indulgences. He also loved spending time at the beach, taking long walks and being active, always striving to care for both body and spirit.

Deeply rooted in his Christian faith, Eric's relationship with God was the foundation of his life. He was a man of strong convictions, unwavering belief and quiet reverence. Church was not just a routine - it was his anchor, and his faith shaped the way he loved, led, and lived. His spiritual strength carried him through life's highest and hardest moments, and it gave peace and purpose to his final days.

Eric is survived by his sons, Cody (Taylor) and Ryder (Kelsey) and his grandchildren Maverick, Wyatt, and Cash - along with grandson-to-be, Beckett. He also leaves behind his sisters, Tammi Wilson and Dawyn Solarzyk and his brother, Brett Wilson. He was preceded in death by his parents, Nancy and Roger Wilson and his brother, Curt Wilson.
