Glen Weeks passed away late in the evening of February 12th, 2022. He was born on September 23rd, 1955 in Hialeah, Florida. He was the beloved son of Bill and Lois Weeks and the youngest of his two siblings, Billy and Joanne. compassion looks like. As a grandpa, he matched his grandkids' energy with an endless reservoir for swimming, wrestling, and playing.

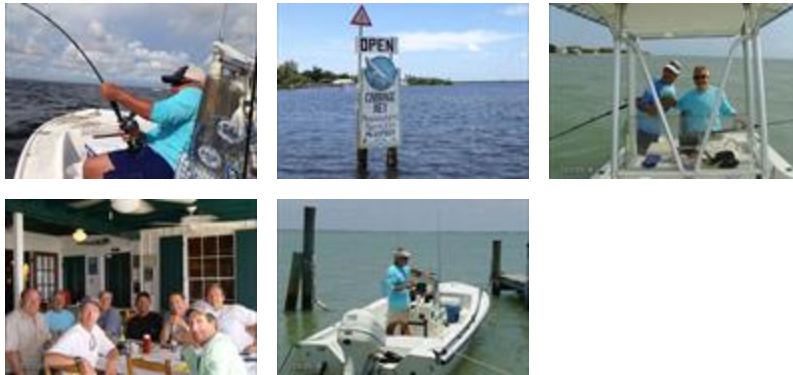

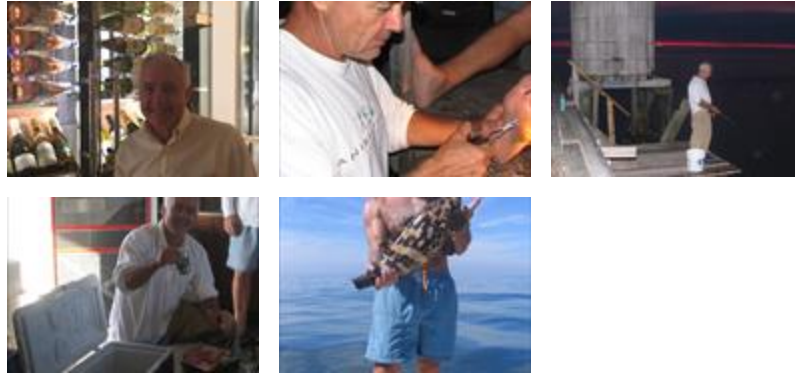
