The times were in the mid sixties, we were free as a bird, not a problem in the world, but one thing was very clear, we always took care of one another. We laughed until we almost cried and cried when things were not going so well. One thing I will always remember about Jack and Mike was our commitment to one another. We often visited The Dutch Goose, a place where liquid refreshments were sold, we never had two nickels to rub together, but somehow found a few bucks to buy a beer and a hotdog. Mike often said the bank where he had a checking account thought The Dutch Goose was a bank since he cashed so many checks there. Jack and I have not seen each other in over 40 years, we started e-mailing each other and it was as if we never left Topeka. Memories, I have so many of Jack it would take an author to write the stories. One thing I will always remember about Jack was his loyalty to his friends. When Jack was in his first year at law school he asked me where he should go in the law enforcement agency. My dad was an FBI Agent, and was extremely loyal to Mr. Hoover. Jack asked dad where he should apply and without hesitation dad said, "Jack, go into The Secret Service, it is a great organization." The rest is history. When Jack was struggling with his cancer we started e-mailing each other and we gave each other encouragement. Jack has been in our prayers ever since I learned of his illness.
