Devoted father, longtime Jupiter Bay resident and friend to all he met, died on Sunday, June 3rd, 2012 at the age of 82. Jim was born in Flushing, NY

He was preceded in death by his parents Henry and Gertrude Imholz, sisters Jeanne and Gertrude and brother Joseph.

He is survived by his children Mary-Jo (Gary) Lee of Richmond, VA, Jeanne Dorner of Flemington, NJ, Janette (Drew) Barnes of Livingston, MT, James C. of Suwanee, GA, Joan (Steve) Apt of Chaska, MN and John of Sharon, CT; grandchildren, Christin, Melanie, Thomas, Jake, John and Jessica.

Jim attended St. Andrews Elementary School in Flushing NY (class president) and Bishop Loughlin High School in Brooklyn, NY. He received a Bachelor of Science degree at Seton Hall University in So. Orange, NJ, an Associates Degree at City College of New York in New York City, and a Masters Degree at St. John's University in Jamaica, NY.

Jim was a US Post Office sub-carrier assisting his father from 1943 to 1951. He was a Korean War Veteran serving in Bordeaux, France (1952-1954) and an American Legion Life Member - Jupiter Post 271.

He pitched for the Queens Alliance baseball League (1945-1952), Seton Hall

University (1949-1952) and the Harrisburg Senators of the Interstate Baseball League (1952). He married Joanne Marion Lock (now of Richmond, VA) .

Jim was a New York City Police Officer (1955-1960) and a New York State Parkway Police Officer (seasonal 1960-75). He taught Driver's Education at Lynbrook High School, Lynbrook NY ("Professor Emeritus") from 1961 to 1987, and coached baseball and ice hockey.
