James D. Weinman died on November 21st, 2022 in West Palm Beach, Florida. James (Jim) was born April 11th, 1934 in Wellsville, New York. He was predeceased by his wife Barbara (Harkness) Weinman. He is survived by his sons Dean Weinman (Kathleen), Gregory Weinman (Christine), Bradley Weinman (Deborah), his sister Janet Jinske, brother Donald Weinman, 11 grandchildren and 14 great grandchildren. He also leaves behind many nieces and nephews and in-laws, as well as, an immeasurable number of great friends.

After serving in the United States Army, Jim attended Cortland State University where he earned a BSE. He was inducted into the Cortland C-Club Hall of Fame in 1998. He, then, attended Penn State University where he earned an M.S. degree in Physical Education. Along with being a well-respected educator, he was a highly regarded High School and College Football coach, amassing impressive records at both levels. He started the football program at Nassau Community College in Garden City, NY in 1968 and continued as the head coach until 1988. He was named National Junior College Coach of the Year on three separate occasions.

Along with his education and coaching career, he enjoyed collecting antiques, hunting, skiing, and golfing. One of the great joys of Jim's life was sailing Oyster Bay and the Long Island Sound with family and friends on his boat,

Robin Hood. He was known as a friendly, warm and outgoing person who was generous with his time and always willing to help others. He enjoyed life to the fullest and will be missed by everyone he knew.

The immediate family will hold a private burial service, as was his request. A memorial gathering for friends and family will be held, at a later date, to celebrate Jim's life.
