Jimmie Kennard Moore, Sr. 82 of Palm Beach Gardens, FL formerly of Bayonne, NJ died suddenly and went home to the Lord on Tuesday January 14, 2020. Jim was a loving husband, father, grandfather, and great-grandfather; he will be dearly missed by all those who loved him.

Jim served in the National Guard and was honorably discharged on February 28, 1963. He retired to Jupiter, Florida in 1996 from the Port Authority Trans Hudson, where he worked as an Electrical Engineer. Jim's retirement in Florida didn't last long and he worked at Oceancrest Condominiums as the Maintenance Manager until he permanently retired in 2013.

Jim was an active member of his community throughout his entire life starting in Bayonne; he was President of the Holy Name Society and very involved in the Boy Scouts where he spent time with his best friend Carmen Panico and their sons. In Jupiter, Jim's dedication to service continued where he was active in the Jupiter Elks, the Knights of Columbus, and he served as a Head Usher and Eucharistic Minister at St. Jude Catholic Church.
