John D. Berger, 95, of Jupiter, FL and Clark Mills, NY passed away on September 7, 2025. John was born on July 12, 1930, in Clark Mills, New York to Peter J. and Mary A. Clark Berger. He graduated from Clinton High School in Clinton, New York in 1948 and matriculated at St. Bonaventure University for one year before serving four years in the United States Air Force. John was a veteran of the Korean War.

Following military service, John resumed his education at Syracuse University and graduated in 1959. He continued with graduate studies at Syracuse until he joined the Ford Motor Company in 1961. After two years with Ford, he returned to the University and continued his studies. In 1962 he began his business career with Kaiser Aluminum and Chemical Company, where he was employed for 19 years. During this period, he attended Harvard University and completed the Program of Management Development in 1965.

John was married to Elaine Barrett in Toronto, Canada for 16 years until their divorce in 1982. He moved to Florida in 1983, having accepted a position as Manager of Sales and Marketing in the development of The Loxahatchee Club, an 18-hole residential golf course designed by Jack Nicklaus. The Loxahatchee Club is regarded as one of South Florida's finest residential golf communities with 258 members and homes. John spent the next 30 years overseeing the development of the course and membership. He always had a

special feeling for the community and its members and staff. He retired from his position in 2013.

Throughout his life, John had a special love of nature, conservation and fly fishing. He traveled to Iceland for fly fishing for Atlantic Salmon for 28 years and often said he had a special love for the island and its people.

John is survived by his sister, Luella, in Raleigh, NC and many nieces and nephews and great- nieces and nephews. John was predeceased by his twin sisters, Bernice DeFrees and Shirley Petrie.

A Funeral Mass will be held at St. Peter Catholic Church on Thursday, September 18th, at 10:30am, in Jupiter, FL (1701 Indian Creek Parkway). The Mass will be livestreamed for those unable to attend.
