Lawrence C. "Larry" Day, 71, of Jupiter, FL, passed away on February 9th, 2021 in hospice care after a brief illness.

He was born in Johannesburg, South Africa, on November 21, 1949, son of the late Terence and Sylvia Day.

Larry met his lovely wife Susan in Johannesburg in 1971 while she was studying nursing. After visiting the United States in 1974, they decided to make Boston, MA their new home. Larry eventually became a naturalized U.S. citizen on Valentine's Day in 1995. A lifelong car enthusiast, Larry turned his passion for automobiles into a successful career, holding positions of leadership throughout the automotive industry for such organizations as Goodyear, Firestone, Montgomery Ward/Automotive Express, and Monro Muffler Brake. Most recently, Larry served as the President, CEO, and Chairman of TBC Corporation in Palm Beach Gardens, FL. Larry was an avid golfer and member of Frenchman's Reserve Country Club.

Larry is survived by his wife, Susan Day; his son Gregory Day and wife Joeleen; and son Nicholas Day and wife Heather; grandchildren Maddox Morin, Noah Day, Charlie Day, and Harrison Day; his sister Margaret Shepherd and husband Allan; nieces Geraldine, Christine, and Tracey; and nephew Bradley.

He is predeceased by his brother Patrick and his nephew Terence.
