Maude E. Pande passed away January 12, 2011 after a 19 year battle with breast cancer. Maude worked as an assistant to her late husband, Larry, at PFM, a national college and university food service company which they started and grew to over 100 locations across 33 states. She served on the school board in Northbrook, IL and was president of the PTA. She was treasurer for the Angels of Charity and was extremely active with The Place of Hope.
