



Dr. Charles Mosher Klein

June 24, 1932 - January 5, 2014

Charles Mosher Klein, age 81 of Jupiter Inlet Colony, FL, passed away Sunday, January 5, 2014. Born in Cleveland, OH and raised in Rocky River, OH, he had been a resident of Jupiter Inlet Colony for sixteen years, coming from Sylvania, OH. He obtained both Bachelor's and Medical Doctor degrees from Western Reserve University in Cleveland, did his residency at the University of Michigan, spent two years at a Naval hospital, and practiced for 28 years as a radiologist for the Toledo Radiological Associates in Toledo, OH.

He was a member of Hobe Sound Community Presbyterian Church. Dr. Klein filled his time building with Habitat for Humanity in Ohio, Florida, and Connecticut, playing tennis, and traveling. Dr. Klein was passionate about educating others through scholarships and gifts. He was also a member of the Tequesta Country Club and the Jupiter Inlet Beach Club.

Survivors include his significant other Beverly Gregory who brought much light, laughter and love to his last two years, his daughter, Janet Klein (Steven Kalata) of Sunnyvale, CA, and seven nieces and nephews Richard Renner, Ann Stillwater, Karen Sargent, Steven Renner, Jeffrey Windahl, Steven Windahl, and David Windahl. He was predeceased by his wife Barbara and his two children, Catherine and James.

Services will be held at the Hobe Sound Community Presbyterian Church on

Saturday January 11, 2014 at 2PM. Another service will be held in Ohio at a later date.

“ Janet -- I'm sorry I was unable to visit with you after the service yesterday. Wife Nancy has some walking problems, and it proved impossible for me deal with that and also attend the reception. Following is what I would have told you if I'd had the chance.

Your dad and I had a number of things in common. We were the same age (I'm 9/9/32). We both served in the Navy. We joined Tequesta Country Club at about the same time, and we met through the club's tennis program.

I have to admit, it took me a little time to figure out your father's unique sense of humor, but once I did, I really came to enjoy it, both on the court and off. I can't begin to count the number of days we spent together, racquets in hand, and when we played as partners we always did well....won a lot more than we lost, I'm sure.

As a lefty, he enjoyed playing the duece court, and as a righty I felt the same about the ad court, so that's the way we usually did it.

Nancy and I stayed in the north longer than usual this year, but I'd been in touch with your father by email, so I was aware of the problem he was having. I had no idea, though, how serious things had become, so quickly. We arrived in Tequesta a week ago today (on Sunday 1/5/14), and I was shocked to learn of his death that very day. I had been looking forward to seeing him, but, sadly, that was not to be.

I'm going to miss him a lot.

Yesterday's service was appropriate and very moving. I know how much you meant to your father, as he would often talk of his visits with you. And it was obvious at the service how close you and your entire family were to him. My deepest sympathy to all of you.

Bev -- How sad to have such a wonderful relationship cut short. My heart goes out to you, and I hope our paths will cross in the future.
