His love and dedication were most evident in the way he helped Rocco learn to walk again after multiple operations, proving that his strength as a father was limitless.

One of Len's greatest passions was golf, which he played almost every Saturday or Sunday. He found immense joy in playing with Susan and Ruan on various golf courses around the world, making the game a cherished family tradition. His love for golf extended beyond playing—he also opened his own driving range, where he was happiest teaching and mentoring others, sharing his passion and expertise with anyone eager to learn.

Len was known for his kindness, generosity, and selflessness. He had an open heart and a giving spirit, always going out of his way to help others, whether in business, friendship, or everyday life. He was the silent strength

behind many, ensuring those he loved were taken care of in every possible way. His impact was immeasurable, and the love and wisdom he shared will be carried on by those whose lives he touched.

Despite his strong and determined spirit, Len faced significant health challenges. He suffered his first heart attack at 45, followed by two more in the years that followed.
