Norman Crump Sudduth, 80, passed away on February 17, 2017, after a very brief illness. Norman was born in Birmingham, AL, on 12/21/36. He attended college and medical school at the University of Alabama (Roll Tide!). On May 4, 1961, he married his high school sweetheart, Rebecca Julia Martin. Dr. Sudduth served as Chief Pathologist at JFK Medical Center, where he was held in high esteem, for over 35 years in Atlantis, Florida. Norman and Rebecca had three daughters who were devoted to him. He enjoyed his work and had a lifelong passion for learning, which he was eager to share with others. He especially enjoyed exploring the topics of religion, economics, and the effect of natural herbs on cancer. Norman and Rebecca split their later years between Jupiter, Florida, and Jackson Hole, Wyoming.

Norman is survived by daughters: Susan (David) Durant, Shaun Weiler, his brother, William (Michele) Sudduth, and 5 grandchildren: Samantha, Aimee, Remington, Evan, and Grant. He was preceded in death by his wife, Rebecca, and his daughter, Shannon.

A celebration of life service will be held at Taylor & Modeen Funeral Home in Jupiter, Florida, on Tuesday, February 21, 2017. Visitation is from 4:00-5:00 pm, with a ceremony of remembrances beginning at 5:00 pm.
