Ronald M. (Bud) Andersen, 92, of Jupiter FL, passed away on Sunday October 2, 2022 in his home surrounded by his family. Ronald was born on July 13, 1930 along with his identical twin brother John K. (Sunny) Andersen in Warren PA, the sons Leonhart Andersen and Doris Snelding Andersen. The boys had two sisters Emilie (Emmy) Rossman and Patricia (Patsy) Fisher of Warren PA, all of whom have passed preceding Ronald.

Following four years of military service in the United States Air Force, Dad enrolled at Pennsylvania State University and graduated in 1958 with a Bachelor's Degree in mechanical engineering. He was employed as an engineer with Pratt & Whitney in Palm Beach County FL for 35 years from 1959 to 1994 and was excited to be a part of the cutting edge jet engine development program including those that powered the Lockheed SR-71 Blackbird. He traveled to many countries in Europe and Asia, including 8 years residing in Japan, representing Pratt & Whitney with his beloved wife Bodil and sons John, Michael and James; and made countless dear friends throughout the world.

Ronald is survived by his loving wife of almost 69 years, Bodil E. Andersen; his sons, Michael Andersen, James (Alicia) Andersen and John (Carrie) Andersen, Michael's former spouse Mary, their seven grandchildren Melissa and her husband Chris, Eric, Heidi and her husband Tim, Laura and her

husband Dominick, Devin and her husband Jordan, Justine and Brooke; and nine great grandchildren, Savanna, Sawyer, James, Ava, Ellie, Jackson, Hendrick, Charlotte and Amelia.
