SUE SCULLY, 85, of Jupiter, FL passed away June 10, 2024, following a 15-year battle with kidney disease and a lifetime of chronic depression.

Sue found help for her depression from the Chicago based mental health, self-help organization “Recovery, Inc.” founded by the late Abraham A. Low. She became an area leader and formed her own Boca Raton/Ft. Lauderdale area meetings. She was also on the Board of Directors which allowed her to travel and preach the self-help method she said, “saved her life!” Sue devoted over 40 years volunteering for Recovery and helped so many people along the way.

Sue was co-owner of Biggy’s Sandwich Emporium (Ft. Lauderdale) serving Chicago style hot dogs, homemade Italian beef and meatball subs just to name a few. Sue later enjoyed her many years working at the Boca Raton Resort & Club as Sales & Marketing administrator and was loved by all.

She enjoyed playing tennis, loved the beach and cooking for her large Italian family. But her favorite thing to do was cuddle up with her Pomeranian “Happy” and escape into a good book.

Sue was born in Chicago, lived in the suburb of Hillside, and in 1973 moved to Coral Springs, FL. She is survived by her former husband William Scully and their children Billy Scully, Cindy Yannette (Chuck), Susan Quirch (Carlos) and grandchildren Danielle, Tony, Christina, Angelina and Joseph; great-grandchildren Rocco, Mia and Anthony; brother H. Michael Biscan (Pat Ryan). She is the beloved daughter of the late Concetta (nee Loizzo) and Henry M.

Biscan, and brother Gary Biscan.

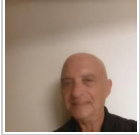

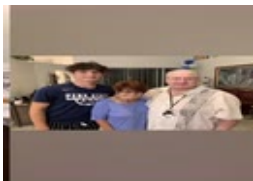
