Thomas A. Farina was born June 3, 1938 in San Francisco California to Orlando Farina and Norma M. (Franzen) Farina. Subsequently, Tom was raised by his mother in Orange, New Jersey.

In the 7th grade, Tom wrote a career report assigned by his English teacher. His mother, who worked for an architect, suggested that he explore that possibility. After researching in the public library, the work of famous American architect, Frank Lloyd Wright, Tom decided that was the career for him. He never wavered and eventually attended Seton Hall Prep and subsequently, entered the School of Architecture at University of Notre Dame, class of 1960. He graduated in 1961 and received the A.I.A. Silver medal for graduating second in his class.

After serving in the Army Reserve, he received his architectural license and began his career. He eventually became President of Design Interface, the construction and real estate development subsidiary of The Hillier Group, Princeton, NJ. Subsequently, he was promoted to Managing Business Partner of Hillier, one of the largest architectural firms in the country. He also served as President of the Newark-Suburban chapter of the A. I. A.

Tom enjoyed all sports and was an avid skier and golfer throughout his entire life. He was a member of Turtle Creek Club, Tequesta, Florida for over 20

years and served as its President from 2006-2008.

Tom felt blessed that throughout his life he was surrounded by all his loving family and especially his mother, Norma

He is survived by his beloved wife, Terry Espinosa Farina of 21 years. He was especially proud of his three wonderful daughters, Dr. Kimberly K. Farina (Greg Saitz), Pamela Jo Farina (Dan Higgins), Liza Jill Davidov (Dr. Tomer Davidov) and stepson Aaron P Cayo. He also leaves his five gifted and lovable grandchildren, Henry Saitz, Rebecca, Benjamin and Natalie Davidov and Greyson Cayo. Tom's half sister, Janet Farina, resides in El Cerrito, CA.

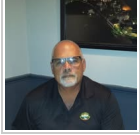
